The Second Grade program in the Washington School District is academic and developmental to ensure that all children's needs are met.

A typical day consists mostly of English language arts, math and social sciences.

The main emphasis is on increased reading fluency and math proficiency.

Students also attend music, computer, gym, art, reading strategies, or library classes on a six day rotation.

Homework assignments are made to ensure practice with the skills presented that day. As daily reminders and to inform parents, students write homework assignments in their planners.
